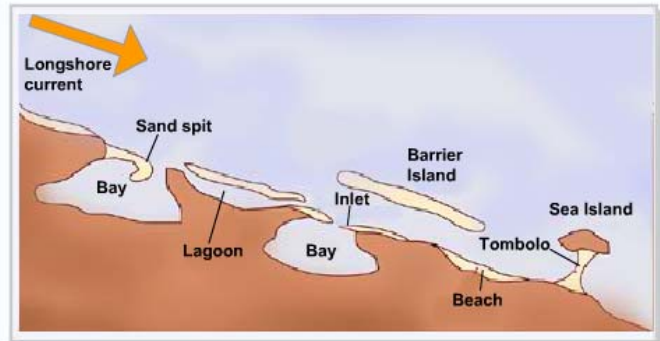
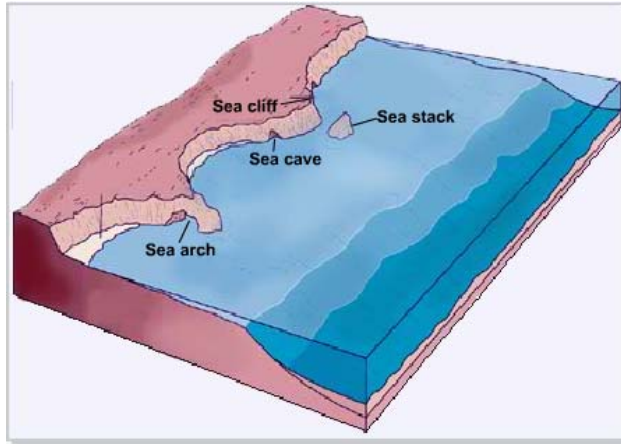


Coastal Deposition



Part	Description
Sea arch	A landform produced when sea caves are excavated so deeply by crashing waves that two caves eroding on opposite sides become joined. The overlying rocky roof is left as an arch.
Sea cave	A small hollow chamber formed by erosional action of ocean waves against a rocky coastline.
Sea cliff	A steep face of rock produced by wave erosion.
Sea stack	A steep, isolated island of rock, separated from the shoreline by the action of waves, as when the overhanging section of a sea arch is eroded away.
Sand spit	Narrow piece of land protruding into the water formed by sand deposits.
Bay	An indentation in the shoreline where water accumulates.
Lagoon	A body of water cut off from a larger body of water.
Bay	An indentation in the shoreline where water accumulates.
Inlet	A narrow passage between two bodies of land.
Barrier island	Forms where sediments build up parallel to land.
Tombolo	A deposit of sand between an island and the mainland. It forms when wave refraction, or the bending of a wave around an island, causes the build up of sand along both sides of an island.
