

# Presentation Form Selection

(Note: this page is just to view the upcoming assignment; you will complete the actual assignment on another page in the course.)

Professional researchers present their research findings in these ways:

- A. Submitting a written report that is published internally (to the company that paid for the research) or in professional publications.
- B. Delivering the report orally at a conference of others interested in the topic. These presentations may include visual props, demonstrations, and/or a PowerPoint presentation.
- C. Posting findings to a web forum on the topic. Postings include visual aids and concise text in compelling layout.

In your assignment, you will take up your torch of knowledge and let it shine brightly by:

1. Selecting a professional presentation method from the list below and organizing your information into **ONE** of these formats:

A. Written Report. Students follow these guidelines:

- Length 5-7 pages (1200-1800 words)
- MLA formatting
- Works Cited page/Paraphrased citations
- Embedded quotations
- 2-dimensional enhancements (photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc)

B. Oral Report. Students follow these guidelines:

- PowerPoint slides 10-25
- Oral presentation length 5-7 minutes
- Verbal paraphrased citations
- Works Cited page (MLA formatting)
- 2 or 3-dimensional enhancements (audio, video, photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc)

C. Web Report. **NOTE on option C:** KCDL does not offer training for web page development, so this option should only be selected by students with the skills needed to complete it.

Students follow these guidelines:

- 1-3 linked web pages with text/media layout
- Works Cited page (MLA formatting) –hyperlinks to Internet sources
- Paraphrased citations

- 2 or 3-dimensional enhancements (audio, video, photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc)2-dimensional enhancements (photos, charts, graphs, illustrations, maps, etc) –hyperlinked or embedded
- Submit the link to your web page for assignment or attach HTML pages
