

- Opening with an activating question.
- Summarizing your topic in 15 words or less.
 - o Knowing what the important 15 words are so that they can be repeated.
- Anticipating 2 questions that might be asked by participants.
- Posing 2 questions to the participants.
- Ending with a summarizing question.

Image Guidelines

An image is worth a thousand words.

Using the correct image will convey ideas and concepts much more effectively than text alone. The correct picture will engage your audience and increase knowledge retention. However, using the wrong picture has no effect at all and will disengage your audience.

TIPS TO REMEMBER WHEN USING IMAGES IN POWER POINT PRESENTATIONS

- 1. Use images that are relevant to the topic and enhance the text on the slide.
- 2. Use an appropriate number of images per slide; too many images will distract the audience.
- 3. Use images that are of high quality, not grainy, hazy, or watermarked.
- 4. Use images that represent a variety of ethnicities, races, ages, and gender.
- 5. Use a caption that provides the image creator's last name (if known) followed by the source for where you retrieved the image.
- 6. Use images that are copyright free.

GUIDELINES FOR IMAGES

- Always use copyright free images.
- Always read and comply with the use restrictions for specific image sources.
- Always provide a caption that includes:
 - 1) Creator's last name or the name of the photo collection
 - 2) Source where the image was retrieved
