It's up to you to sift through layer upon layer of truth until you determine for yourselves which version sounds the most true. There are certain points that I must prove to you. Point number one: Andrew Beckett was – is, a brilliant lawyer. Great lawyer. Point number two: Andrew Beckett, afflicted with a debilitating disease – maybe understandable, personal. He had the legal choice to keep the fact of his illness to himself. Point number three: His employees discovered his illness, and ladies and gentlemen, the illness that I am referring to is AIDS. Point number four: They panicked."
